SUBJECT: UPDATED HEALTH PROTOCOLS FOR ONSITE MIDTERM EXAMINATION

There have been some reported cases of mild, symptomatic, COVID-19 positive individuals inside the campus. Although Health Protocols for the Onsite Midterm Examination have been issued already, please be guided by the following:

- 1. All individuals must assure, to the best of their ability, that they are COVID-19 free, have not been exposed to potential carrier, or have not been tagged as suspect or probable case before entering the AU SL premises.
- 2. Students with fever are discouraged to attend the onsite examination.
- 3. Wearing of proper face masks indoor is optional but is highly encouraged for senior citizens, <u>individuals who have cough and colds</u>, are not fully vaccinated, and are immunocompromised.
 - 4. Wash Hands and use Hand sanitizer frequently. Hand Sanitizers, alc ohol, and liquid soaps are provided at designated areas around the campus and inside AUSL school premises.
 - 5. For Quarantine and Isolation Protocols: Please refer to the table below

	Masking / Quarantine / Isolation Protocols
Asymptomatic close contact exposed to confirmed COVID-19 positive individual.	 No nee to quarantine; and Wear a well-fitted face mask for 10 days.
Asymptomatic but confirmed COVID-19 positive case	afebrile/Fever-free for at least 24 hrs. without using antipyretics (e.g. Paracetamol) and with improvement of respiratory symptoms whichever is earlier; and wear a well-fitted face mask for 10 days.
Confirmed COVID-19 positive case with mild sypmtoms or individuals with acute respiratory sypmtoms	
	your healthcare provider.
CONFIRMED COVID-19 positive case with moderate to severe symptoms or Immunocompromised	 Isolation for 10 days from onset of sign and symptoms following advise of the attending physician, including whether to be admitted in a health care facility; and Wear a well-fitted face mask for 10 days.
	Note: For severe disease and immunocompromised, discontinue isolation only upon the advice of your healthcare provider.

Optimized ventilation as well as proper hygiene and other measures to avoid transmission risks will continue to be implemented to prevent the spread of infection in our university setting.

Whilst the state of public health emergency has already been lifted, the health sector of the AUSL shall continue to remain vigilant to ensure a dequate health system capacity in the event that it is required.

Finally, updated guidelines from time to time will be issued based on the Alert Level System issued by the Department of Health and the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases.



In preparation for the return of the onsite classes, please be guided by the following:

Before Entry

To maximize the well-being, and health benefits for students, and to ensure a well-conceived emergency preparedness, students are required to submit the duly accomplished <u>Medical Information Sheet</u> online. Those who have submitted before need not submit again. This form can be accessed through the AIMS Portal (arellanolaw.edu).

This would aid AUSL health personnel deliver the most appropriate and effective treatment and support, as well as in assessing and responding to health issues when the need arises.

Rest assured that all the data gathered will be strictly confidential. Students, however, may opt not to answer certain sensitive questions.

Students with fever, flu-like symptoms, and unexplained or undiagnosed rashes are discouraged to take the exam onsite.
